### Implementing the new CMS guidelines for wound care: areas ...

Wound measurements as part of wound description: 1. The wounds should be numbered when more than one wound is observed and described. 2. Each wound should have measurements of length, width, depth in centimeters. Wound measurements as part of op note for debridement: 1. The wound measurements should be given both pre- procedure and post-procedure. This indicates whether the procedure expanded the wound margins (helpful in supporting excisional debridement). 2.

Final code selection is based on the size of the repair. The length of the wound repaired must be measured and recorded in centimeters, whether curved, angular, or stellate. If the wound measurements are documented in inches or millimeters, instead of centimeters, convert the measurements to centimeters before selecting the appropriate code.

CMS adheres to the following guidelines: Stage 1 pressure injuries and deep tissue injuries are termed "pressure injuries" because they are closed wounds. Specifically, this code is to be used for application of a skin substitute graft to a wound surface area size of 0 to 25 sq cm (first 25 sq cm within the maximum wound size grouping up to 100 sq cm). If the foot/toe wound area is greater than 25 sq cm, but less than the maximum of group size up to 100 sq cm, then bill CPT 15275 plus CPT 15276
