NPUAP Pressure Injury Stages The updated staging system includes the following definitions: Pressure Injury: A pressure injury is localized damage to the skin and underlying soft tissue usually over a bony prominence or related to a medical or other device. The injury can present as intact skin or an open ulcer and may be painful.

NPUAP Pressure Injury Stages

There are a number of stages of pressure ulcers defined by the National Pressure Ulcer Advisory Panel. Stage I: non-blanchable. Stage II: partial thickness. Stage III: full thickness skin loss.

On April 13, 2016, the National Pressure Ulcer Advisory Panel (NPUAP) announced changes in pressure ulcer terminology and staging definitions. Providers can adapt NPUAP's changes for their clinical practice and documentation, but it's important to note that, as of press time, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) has not adopted the changes.
