Ovarian cancer often is at an advanced stage by the time it is diagnosed. And the cancer comes back, or recurs, after treatment in more than 80% of women with the disease. Most women newly diagnosed with ovarian cancer have initial surgery first to remove as much of the tumor as possible, usually followed by chemotherapy.

BTW, I was diagnosed with Stage 4 Ovarian cancer in March 1999 with massive pulmonary embolisms. My Ca 125 was a staggering 9,800. This meant none of the 'usual' surgery - at least not right away, so I had 3 chemos (Taxol and Carboplatin) before surgery and 6 following surgery. After treatment was completed, I was 'disease free'.

Stage 3 ovarian cancer has spread outside the pelvis into the abdominal cavity or to lymph nodes. Treatment is surgery and chemotherapy. The stage of a cancer tells the doctor how far it has grown and if it has spread. The tests and scans you have to diagnose your cancer will give some information about the stage.

Patients diagnosed with stage III ovarian cancer have cancer that has spread from the ovaries and pelvic organs into the upper abdomen or lymph nodes. Currently, the standard treatment for stage III ovarian cancer consists of both surgery and systemic treatment with chemotherapy.

Partial hysterectomy or total hysterectomy. A partial hysterectomy removes your uterus, and a total hysterectomy removes your uterus and your cervix. Both procedures leave your ovaries intact, so you can still develop ovarian cancer. Total hysterectomy with salpingo-oophorectomy.

Surgery for advanced ovarian cancer Advanced cancer means your cancer has spread away from the ovary (stages 2, 3 and 4). You have surgery to remove your ovaries, fallopian tubes, womb and cervix. Your surgeon aims to remove as much of the cancer as possible if it has spread to other areas in your pelvis or abdomen.

Typically, women who have ovarian cancer are initially treated with surgery, followed by systemic chemotherapy. If the cancer recurs (returns) after treatment, additional systemic therapy may be used to increase survival time and relieve the symptoms of the cancer.

Surgery for ovarian cancer Surgery may be the first treatment for ovarian cancer, and is sometimes needed to make the diagnosis, or may follow a course of chemotherapy (aimed at shrinking the cancer). Surgery is done through a cut in the abdomen (tummy) - what is removed and how this is done depends upon the size and spread of the tumour (cancer).

A series of 135 consecutive patients who underwent tertiary surgery for relapsed ovarian cancer was published in 2011. 27 Complete tumor resection was achieved in 53 patients (39.3%). The 30-day operative mortality rate was 6%. Seventy-eight patients (57.8%) died, whereas 52 patients (38.5%) suffered from further relapse within the median ...

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
